Islands Hospice is a proud partner of the HMSA Supportive Care Program which provides extra support and care to patients and families undergoing curative treatment for serious or life-threatening illnesses.

What can supportive care do for you?

Separate from hospice care, supportive care is provided in addition to ongoing medical treatment. Our program is centered on helping patients and families navigate the complexities of critical health issues, and achieve physical, emotional, and spiritual well-being.

In additional to your regular care, our patients have access to:



24-hour on-call medical services and telephonic nursing support



Medical equipment, supplies, and comfort medications with personalized support



Help navigating treatment plans



Spiritual support visits



Other caregiver assistance



Who is eligible?

The HMSA Supportive Care program accepts patients with a range of serious illnesses, including but not limited to, advanced cancer, class 3 or 4 congestive heart failure, and advanced COPD. If you or a loved one are managing a serious illness, please contact us directly to discuss eligibility.



How it works

The HMSA Supportive Care program is designed to support patients for 90 days during a 12-month period. Patients can also receive support from other community-based programs such as home health. At the end of Supportive Care services, patients may return to their usual medical care or transition to palliative or hospice care services based on their illness and medical needs.
